Relevant Question

Does the gospel really need to be **preached**?

Peter replies with Relevant Answer

No doubt you will now quote Francis - “Preach the gospel, and if necessary, use words.” (*Such expressions are widely attributed to Francis, but no published source has yet been located prior to the early 1990s*). I prefer the Bible as a foundation for truth...“**Preach** the gospel, in season and out of season...how will they believe unless they hear, how will they hear unless there is a **preacher**...Jesus returned **preaching** the gospel...go and **preach** the gospel...this gospel must first be **preached**... Yes, Jesus went about doing good...but He clearly *proclaimed* that there is an alternative Kingdom at hand and called people, as did His forerunner

and relative John, to change their thinking and lifestyle and become a part of it ... now, as well as in eternity. An unspoken word is no word at all. An un-preached gospel is no gospel at all. “If only you had *said*...” “Why didn't you *tell* me...?” Of course it is important to engage in good works...faith without works is dead etc, but the power in a blessing is in speaking it, there is power in the tongue to bring life. The Holy Spirit fell at first as tongues of fire, on individual heads, so signifying that each can preach, everyone has a story to tell. So, yes, the gospel does need to be **preached**! It is the power of God unto salvation.
